The National Travel Assistance may help pay for some travel costs when you are referred to a specialist.

If your specialist refers you to see a specialist at a different location, you may be eligible for travel assistance. If eligible, you will get financial help towards your travel and possibly your accommodation costs.

If you are a Community Services card holder and travel more than 80k one way, per visit, you may qualify.

With our fuel costs these days and accommodation costs hard to find on a Pension, this can be great help in times of need.


I look forward to working with a new committee and another year of being your Treasurer, unless of course someone else would like the position?

Rates rebate

A Rates Rebate may be available to home owners throughout New Zealand if they are on a low income and meet and a certain criteria. This rebate can be up to \$750.00 and is provided by the NZ Government.

Once you receive your rates bill, you can apply for a rebate for the current rating year period 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. You must return your application to the council by 30 June 2024.

The Application Forms are available from your local Council or on-line at: www.govt.nz. Once on that website type 'Rates' into the Search Box then select the Rate Rebate option you require.

Super Gold Card

Super Gold Card is for people aged 65 and older (it doesn't expire). It gives you instant discounts and special offers at thousands of businesses across New Zealand and Australia. To find out about SuperGold Card and how to get one go to

website www.workandincome. govt.nz/eligibility/seniors The website which gives all the Super Gold Card discount information is www.supergold.govt.nz

I have been advised that AA will print your photograph on your Gold Card so this can be used as a Photo I.D. They do the whole process including taking your photograph at no charge.

Important notice for all Members

The following subject will be discussed at our May 2024 AGM

NZ Companies Office – Incorporated Societies GREY POWER TAUPO INCORPORATED (476889)

We have been advised by the **New Zealand Companies Office** that we need to reregister our Society under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022 (2022 Act) to remain an incorporated society. This will have to be done before 2026.

Our AGM will be an opportunity to agree on reregistration. Changes to our society's constitution can be done at a later date.

Basically, we will discuss:

1. Does Grey Power Taupo want to re-register under the 2022 Act or do nothing and have it liquidated and ceases to exist in its current form? After the discussion has been completed we will then take

- a vote to proceed or not to proceed with reregistration.
- 2. If we do decide to re-register then we have to review the constitution and make changes to ensure it complies with the 2022 Act. This can be done at a later date.
- 3. The reregistration decision should be made at the 2024 AGM so please think very carefully about how you would like us to proceed and even think about joining the committee and being part of the running of Grey Power Taupo.
- 4. If we fail to elect a committee at the 2024 AGM then **Grey Power Taupo cannot** reregister so our incorporated

- society based on the 1908 Act will be liquidated and ceases to exist.
- 5. We will need at least 3 executive committee members to start the review of our constitution and then to make any recommended changes. These recommendations will be brought to the 2025 AGM (or at a special general meeting called) for discussion and any changes made will then be put to a vote to be accepted and approved.
- 6. Once we have an approved constitution it can be reregistered online. Registration is FREE.

A Sticky Situation

Let's talk wax, ear wax. A small amount of wax in our ears is normal and even helpful. It repels insects (a very good thing in my opinion!), provides lubricant to our ears, it is anti-bacterial and traps airborne impurities.

What happens when we have too much of a good thing? Some of us build up too much wax causing problems with our hearing and blocking our hearing aids. At this point, a professional is recommended. The safest way to have your ears cleaned is suction. Basically, a mini vacuum for your ears. This is to ALWAYS be done by an ear nurse or audiologist who has gone through training specifically for ear suctioning. Do not allow an administrator to do this. Believe it or not I have seen it happen in other clinics. If needed, the ear nurse or audiologist may need to use curettes or forceps to finish pulling the wax out of your ears. In my years as an audiologist, I have seen many permanently damaged ears due to incorrectly administered wax removal. Laura Arnold Audiology has an Ear Nurse on staff every Thursday afternoon. 28th February 2024

Malcolm Laycock from the *Taupo St John Health Shuttle Service* gave us an address on the operation of The Taupo Health Shuttle Service.

The New Zealand St John Health Shuttle Service, which Taupo is part of, has over 100 vehicles and 800 volunteers and they travel over 70,000 km per year.

Taupo operation started about 4 years ago and has 8 volunteer drivers and they cover the Taupo District from Rangitaiki to Turangi and Broadlands to Mangakino. They mainly transport people from Taupo to Rotorua for medical appointments and operate Monday to Friday between 8.30am to 3pm. Last year they did 189 day trips and travelled 29,000 km.

They operate on donations and also get a grant from the Government. They are always looking for more volunteers and are looking to get a special vehicle.

Malcolm was supported by John Haywell.


