EASTER HEDGEHOG SLICE

For the base

250g shortbread biscuits 1/2 cup desiccated coconut Cocoa powder Ground cinnamon Milk chocolate, chopped Butter, chopped Sweetened condensed milk

For the topping

White chocolate, chopped Kremelta, or coconut oil Mini chocolate Easter eggs (60)

Directions

- 1 Lightly oil and line a 24cm x 20c slice pan with baking paper.
- 2. Crush the shortbread with a rolling pin leaving some as little chunks. Place in a bowl with the coconut, cocoa powder and ground cinnamon. Mix well.
- 3. Melt the chocolate and butter together with the sweetened condensed milk on low heat.

- 4. Pour into the dry ingredients and mix again.
- 5.Press into the lined pan. Chill until set.
- 6 Melt the white chocolate with the Kremelta, stirring often. Pour over the base. Allow to set a little then top with the mini Easter eggs.

This year postage alone has cost the Federation \$134,419 for 3 issues – potentially around \$180,000 for the year. With escalating postage costs the magazine postage now consumes over 60% of the capitation fees from the membership, leaving far less for Grey Power's core business of advocating for older people.
